Part A: The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year.

The IQAC has been continuing its efforts for quality up-gradation of the institution. At the beginning of the session (2010-11), IQAC had taken some steps to enhance the academic and other activities of the institution. As far as curricular aspect is concerned, College authority had applied for a number of job-oriented vocational courses to the UGC, interface meeting of which is yet to be fixed by the UGC

The faculty members of the college took initiative and kept in contact with the Sarguja University authorities urging them to modify the syllabus of certain subjects. The University authorities also took some remedial steps towards removing the anomalies of the syllabi. The English, Botany, Geography, History and Physics departments of the college organized a number of departmental as well as inter-departmental seminars, popular talks and workshops in the college during the session.

Keeping in mind the teaching, learning and evaluation process, lesson plans are prepared and transmitted to the students by faculty members of different departments at the beginning of the session. The IQAC encourages the practice of collecting and analyzing student's feedback at the end of the session through the department concerned. By providing necessary books and study materials, the faculty members keep in personal contact with the advanced learners. The feed backs make it amply clear that the advanced students have suitably benefited. The teaching learning process has been made more attractive and more effective through frequent use of the OHP, LCD, Multimedia, Cassettes, CD's and Audio-Visuals. The Faculty members of the college have regularly participated in seminars /Workshops /Refresher Courses /Orientation Programmes during this period. As far as Research, Consultancy & Extension is concerned, the college is

proud to have two more Ph. D degree holders during this period. Another three faculty members have completed their research and will be able to submit their theses soon. Some of the faculty members have applied for minor research projects while some are engaged in Minor and Major Research Projects with financial assistance from the UGC. Dr Raj Kamal Mishra, Asst. Professor of English Dept. has completed his MRP on the topic “Colonial Consciousness in Major Indian English Fiction” sponsored by UGC and Dr Vishwasi Ekka, Asst. Professor of Hindi Dept. is undergoing her MRP on “Sarguja ke Lokgeeto me abhivyakt bhakti bhav ka vivechan”. Four faculty members of the college have been recognized as Ph.D. guides by the Sarguja University, and some have even applied for the supervisorship under various universities viz. the Sarguja University, the Guru Ghasidas University, Bilaspur (C.G.) and Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur (C.G.). The research promotion cell of the college is involved in creating an environment of research in the campus.

With the utilization of the fund obtained from UGC for building the infrastructure and enhancing the learning resources of the college. It has enabled the college to fulfill the long felt demands like the construction of a Student’s Reading Room adjoining to the Library, purchasing more books & journals for the library, procurement of equipments and renovation and up gradation of the laboratories of Chemistry, Botany and Zoology. In addition, the Photostat machine and other facilities procured for the college library have made it more student-friendly. The Multi-gym facility installed earlier had attracted the students and enabled them to become more health conscious. With the assistance from UGC, the college has a well furnished English Language Lab, and an Audio-Visual hall well equipped with Digital Board.

The State Government offers financial aids to the students of ST, SC and OBC categories, in the form of scholarships. Special remedial classes for ST, SC students were undertaken for the various streams of Arts, Science and Commerce. For students the college avails the travel concession scheme provided by the Railways. The Career Guidance Cell of the college has been displaying information on the notice board regarding prospective career and job opportunities. Likewise, the Extension Cell and the Women Cell have been extending their activities to a large extent. The Alumni as well as Guardians of the students have been extending their support as and when sought for. In the organizational management field, the college has promulgated the new system of ‘The Chhattisgarh College Employee’s

(Provincialisation) Act 2003' as per the directives of the Director of Higher Education. Under the Chairmanship of Dr V. K. Verma, the Governing Body of the College has been functioning efficiently by taking necessary steps to maintain academic, financial discipline as well as infrastructural development.

The College is imparting degrees in Science, Commerce, Social Sciences, Psychology, Humanities and Law courses as a regular course of study at undergraduate level. There are other streams of studies including the 13 PG courses in English, Hindi, History, Geography, Chemistry, Physics, Sociology, Mathematics, Economics, Botany and Zoology which are taken under the autonomous scheme. Several other courses are also undertaken such as-

- (a) PGDCA course under the Sarguja University.
- (b) Research Centres in English, Hindi, History, Geography, Chemistry, Physics, Psychology, Sociology, Mathematics, Economics, Botany and Zoology of the Sarguja University.

At the same time, the internal roads of the College campus have been metalled and greatly improved. A large garden is under construction in front portion of the college campus. As a part of participatory management different committees as well as different cells comprising of faculty members have been reconstituted for the smooth functioning of the college.

Part B:

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution:

The primary goal is to provide excellent higher education to the youth of this semi-urban area. Some of the activities are mentioned below:

- (a) Post Graduate diploma courses like PGDCA.
- (b) M.A/ M. Sc/M.Com & other Post Graduate diploma courses.

- (f) Encouragement to the faculty members for attending Seminars, Refresher/Orientation courses etc. and to apply for MRPs and Teachers Fellowships of UGC.
- (g) Encouragement to the teachers as well as students of the college to associate themselves in different extension activities.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG):

The college has Research centers affiliated to the Sarguja University in various subjects viz. English, Hindi, History, Geography, Chemistry, Physics, Psychology, Sociology, Mathematics, Economics, Botany and Zoology, as also the Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application (PGDCA) of Sarguja University has been in the college.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction:

Faculty members of the college always try to apply new ideas beyond the limit of prescribed syllabus in curriculum design and its transaction with the students. Field trips are arranged by some departments on their own to give practical learning experience to the students. Bioscience departments particularly take initiative in field study to give first-hand knowledge to their students. Similarly, to cater to the curiosity of the students as well as for giving first hand information regarding the constellations, galaxies or identification of stars, special sky observation nights are arranged by the departments of Physics and Mathematics.

- (i) Electronics taught by the Department of Physics.

5. Examination reforms implemented:

The college follows the examination norms formulated by the Sarguja University. The college has adopted a strategy to improve the academic standard of the students by holding unit tests, terminal examinations and test examinations. Marks are displayed in the respective departmental notice boards. The examination for the Post-Graduate courses is conducted semester wise by the Autonomous Department of this college.

6. Candidates qualified: NET/ SLET/ GATE etc.:

The College has some faculties who have qualified NET/ SET/GATE. A number of students of this college have also qualified but systematic records of those students are not available now.

7. Initiative towards faculty development programme:

In spite of the difficulties faced by the college in the arrangement of classes and completion of course curriculum within the specified time period, we do not hesitate to inspire the faculty members to attend refresher and orientation courses, seminars, workshops, conferences etc. at regular intervals. The faculty members are provided all relevant information regarding research methodology as well as the procedures for applying for research projects sponsored by the UGC and other financing bodies.

25. Computerization of administration and the process of admissions and examination results, issue of certificate:

The computerization of admission process such as processing of application forms, preparation of merit list etc. has already been initiated. Similarly, the process of entering the bio-data of the admitted students for future records has been continuing since few years back.

The process of college unit test and test examination are partially computerized. computerization of annual results of University examinations are yet to be completed. College certificates are issued on printed sheets. On the other hand, the college is planning for complete computerization of the office during the current academic session.

26. Increase in infrastructural facilities:

Infrastructural facilities have increased as follows –

28. Computer and internet access and training to teachers and students:

Almost all the faculty members and a majority of students are acquainted with the use of computer. The habit of internet surfing by an increasing number of students is an indication of the computer savvy environment of the college. The computer-facilities offered by the college as

well as access to Internet have been availed by most of the faculty members to its optimum. Both the facilities are availed by the senior students. .

29. Financial aid to students:

Financial aids in the form of State and National scholarships are offered to the students of ST/SC/OBC categories of the college. In addition to this, the College authorities sympathetically consider the economically disadvantaged students and felicitate such students in getting admission to the college as well as at the time of deposition of the examination fee to university on installment basis and in certain cases waiving of fees. The College also helps the students to avail the benefit of the Railway Travel Concession.

30. Activities and support from the Alumni Association:

The Alumni of the college had already an association prior to the year of the previous NAAC assessment of the college. Though the activities of the Association were marginal one during the session and that too not in an organized form, some of the alumni in their individual capacity were involved in academic activities. Delivering talks, seminar lectures, sharing knowledge and information with the students and teachers or extending help in organizing different programmes which reflects the emotional bonding of the alumni with the college community.

31. Activities and support from the Parent – Teacher Association:

Formal Parent Teacher association is yet to be formed. But some parents at their individual level have offered support and extended their advices and suggestions at the time of need.

32. Health services:

- a) The hygienic condition of the college canteen has been regularly monitored by the members of the sub-committee for Health & Hygiene.
- b) Students and staff of the college utilized the newly established Multi-gym facility during the entire session.

- c) Records of blood group of teaching and non teaching staff of the along with their phone numbers has been prepared and circulated among staff members. It is also displayed in the notice board for the benefit of the college fraternity.

33. Performance in sports activities:

Students of the college have always taken an active interest in sports activities and enthusiastically participated in various sporting events like Hand-ball, Badminton, Cricket, Chess, Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Table-Tennis and Athletics. In this session About 45 of our students participated in various State Level Tournaments and 15 students took part in the Inter-University Tournament held at National Level.

34. Incentives to outstanding sports person:

The college has provisions according to which incentives are given to outstanding sports persons. For instance the college felicitated two of the students, Manish Gupta and Venkat Gaurav Prasad, Badminton players of International recognition who have dually participated in various events in several countries and who are placed in Government Services. Ashutosh Pratap Singh, another student has played in the Ranji Trophy and is a former Captain of the Madhya Pradesh cricket-team. Another student, Manoj Singh has played in the national 20-20 Cricket Tournament, the ICL league. Many students have have been able to get recruitments in the State Police Services and in Defence Services through the Sports Quota.

35. Student achievements and awards:

A good number of students from different departments have secured first class with Distinction / first division at the Graduation level Examinations as well as at Post Graduate level Examinations. Likewise many of the students have showed proficiency in cultural events, and some have been awarded by the state/university.

36. Activities of the Guidance and Counselling unit:

Besides, providing the career counseling to students of all the three faculties together with students of Computer Science and Law at college level in collaboration with leading institutes and personals almost 60% of the

faculty members are also actively associated with research Guidance and career counseling

37. Placement services provided to students:

- (a) For performing official works, computers are provided to the non – teaching staff. The bearers of various departments are trained to use the departmental computers.

- (c) At the request of the college authority the H. S. Jaiswal & Co. Chartered Accountants gave training to the UDA & LDA on Accounts Keeping, calculation of Income Tax etc.

- a) College authorities ensure that value–based education is imparted to the students. On some occasions like Freshman-Social, Annual Day etc. academicians or learned persons of the locality are invited to delivering speech and to interact with students.
- b) For the sake of exposure, students as well as teachers of the college are encouraged to participate in the programmes organized by other institutions.
- c) Popular talks on various topics are arranged for creating scientific temperament, eradicating superstition, prevention of AIDS, to inculcate the importance of preserving the healthy natural environment etc. and spreading the message to the society through the students.

- d) The Republic Day, Independence Day, National Science Day and World Environment Day are observed in the college campus with the active participation of students and faculty members. NSS members have been playing an active role in keeping the college campus clean and green.

- To provide more germ-free clean drinking water facility with cooling system
- To enhance of intake capacity of the college.
- To develop infrastructure to facilitate remedial coaching for ST/SC/OBC (non creamy layer) and minorities.
